

WHAT DOES ALIANNE SEE?

A basic concept and sentence expansion activity

General Information

This activity is appropriate for children ages 3 and up with significantly delayed receptive and expressive language skills. This activity targets basic concepts such as adjectives. It also targets sentence expansion. It also targets underlying skills such as naming and identifying objects and early reading skills.

Directions

Say: This is Alianne. She loves to go on walks to see many different things. Let's talk about the things she sees.

Point and Say: This is Alianne. This is a tree. What does the tree look like?

Give the child a chance to answer. After 3-5 seconds, if an answer is given confirm correct answers or modify incorrect answers. If the answer is incorrect,

Say: tall tree. Alianne sees a tall tree. What does Alianne see?

Give the child a chance to imitate or repeat.

Continue this way with the rest of the set of pictures listed. Start at the phrase level for the child only using one word utterances. Start at the sentence level for the child only using phrases.

You can also start off by working with receptive language skills, by only having the child identify the basic concepts through pointing and vice versa for expressive language skills.
